

The Oldenburg Town Council met Monday, October 7th, 2024 at 7:00 PM at the Town Hall. After being called to order by Councilman Greg Struewing, the minutes of the August meeting were brought forth and Councilman Dave Wahman made a motion to approve, Councilman Struewing seconded the motion. President Dennis Moeller was absent.

Councilman Struewing reviewed Old Business: handrail bids for the Municipal building are still forthcoming and will be reviewed at the November meeting. Councilman Struewing also reviewed the fencing and dead tree removal proposal from Greenacres. Town attorney John Kellerman is still working on converting the Town Ordinances to electronic format. Carrie Roessner is working with INDOT regarding the ongoing speeding issue on 229 near her home. The drain culvert on the corner of Sycamore and Vine has been replaced and the concrete is curing.


Father John provided an update from the Holy Family Church Picnic and stated there was a great turnout, but preliminary numbers look like less of a profit than 2023's picnic.

Town member Kevin Doyle discussed the process for meeting minutes and requested an improved system for notification, particularly in regards to items that are being voted on at upcoming meetings. Attorney John Kellerman suggested a monthly agenda be published, prior to each month's meeting.


Officer Bill Dramann discussed an increased police presence over the weekend prior to assist in searching for a missing persons report. He also mentioned the need for updated signage throughout town, as our stop signs are becoming faded. Councilman Struewing made not to mention it to the engineering firm in charge of the Water Street/Federal Grant Project. An update was requested of Officer Dramann regarding moving the stop sign at the corner of Washington and Water. This item remains unresolved and will be reviewed again at the November meeting.

Old business discussion continued; Councilman Struewing discussed the parking issue in front of Dr. Konnersman's dental office. Attorney John Kellerman confirmed there's not much action the town can take as the road is a state highway. Councilman Struewing proposed talking with the homeowner/renter who owns the vehicle that is being parked in that location.

Councilman Wahman made a motion to adjourn, and Councilman Struewing seconded.
