

The Oldenburg Town Council met Monday, May 4, 2026 at 7:00 PM at the Municipal Building meeting room. After being called to order by President Brian Clagg, the minutes from the previous April 6, 2026 meeting were approved. Councilman Kerker made a motion to approve, Councilman Wahman seconded. All in favor.

First, President Clagg discussed having himself appointed as President of the Fire Territory board. Councilman Kerker made a motion to approve, Wahman seconded. Town Attorney, John Kellerman swore in President Clagg as President of the Fire Territory.

Next, Dan Kerker spoke regarding the upcoming plans for Summerbash which is scheduled for Saturday, June 27<sup>th</sup>. Needs include: road closure the night before, traffic control, and help promoting the festival.

Next on the agenda, President Clagg discussed the Porsche Club of Indianapolis and Cincinnati, whom would like to bring their cars on September 19<sup>th</sup> from 11-4PM and patronize the shops and restaurants. Clagg discussed with Marshal Boesken the closure of Pearl Street during those times. Clagg informed the Club about 4:30 mass on Saturday and the Club will try to finish up by 3.

Clagg then discussed the portable toilets for the pickleball court. Quotes were obtained from Port-A-Let's Sanitation and KB Brown Septic Service, LLC. Let's quoted \$150 for a standard unit and \$180 for an ADA accessible unit. Brown's was \$125 for standard and \$125 for ADA accessible. Councilman Kerker made note that Keith Brown is his brother-in-law, but thinks he does a nice service. A motion to approve the Brown quote was made by Councilman Wahman. Seconded by Kerker.

Further, stump grinding quotes were obtained for the north side of the Freudenfest shelter where the three trees were removed. All quotes were for stump grinding, removal of the grindings, and grading/re-seeding of the area. Enzinger's Painting & Tree Service quoted \$900, On the Grind Stump Grinding (Dustin Lamping,) quoted \$1350 and Ben Wahman Excavating quoted \$2750. A motion to approve Enzinger's quote made by Councilman Kerker. Seconded by Wahman. All in favor.

Next Jeff Paul discussed the shade shelter at the Walking Trail. Bird Hollow Construction is utilizing Randy Schrank for lumber and hoping to construct by end of May/early June. Leising's will be attaching the benches to the concrete pads with bollards, trash cans and line painting still to come. Council and Jeff discussed the basketball posts which will require volunteers to re-paint before installation.

Paul and Clagg further discussed the shade tarp for Freudenfest and plans to drill holes for posts. Motion to approve made by Kerker, seconded by Wahman, all in favor.

Next President Clagg discussed Deputy Marshal Wolfer's resignation. Wolfer plans to stay on as a Reserve Officer and continue assisting with IT related items for the Town. Discussion regarding obtaining a new deputy. CT Hunter will work on advertisement efforts.

Next Clagg discussed Marshal Boesken's need for obtaining Spillman, a program that connects dispatchers with each officer. For three MFA licenses (username and password) it is \$68 a person, for

Spillman installation for desktop, tablet, and computer (in car) and the VPN, it is \$499. Programming, and syncing with Franklin County Sheriff's department will be an additional \$499 for a total of \$1,202. A motion to approve the costs was made by Councilman Kerker. Seconded by Wahman. All in favor.

Next, President Clagg discussed the Primary Election and the ballot to change Oldenburg Town Council from 3 to 5 members. Reminder made to vote!

Clagg and CT Hunter discussed budgeting/payment for portable toilets.

Lastly, Richard Cartwright and Clagg discussed repairs to the town message board. Repairs totaling \$324. Motion to accept the costs made by Kerker, seconded by Wahman. All in favor.

OB:

Question regarding town hall exterior doors and painting them. Councilman Wahman discussed Randy Stevenson coming in to take a look at the doors and trying to fix them. Doors will likely be painted.

Clagg questioned the Water Loss Audit which was explained by Jeff Paul and is handled by Les Day (plant operator) The town purchases water from Batesville, sells it to our customers, and then we report our lost water that's not being paid for. Utility is in the process of putting in meters at the fire bay and at the kitchen area, so water will be metered – not billed, but metered for measuring loss.


Oldenburg.in.gov email addresses discussed. Clagg is working on obtaining .gov email addresses for council and clerk.

Community member Steve Amrhein discussed water issues at 22081 Water Street, stating the area is constantly wet. Water main is on the opposite side of the street, could possibly be a spring issue. Clagg will take a look at it.

Jeff Paul discussed street signs that need to be fixed/need new ones ordered. Volunteers to service signs.

Community member Paul Selkirk questioned the Water Street project. Letting is 2028, which is fiscal year 2029. Up next is attaining right of way.
